They may compile lists of mortgages, contracts and other instruments pertaining to titles by searching public and private records for law firms, real estate agencies or title insurance companies.


What LB 345 does

This legislation will strike the 1-year experience requirement.

State Specific Information

According to the Institute for Justice, this license is required in 6 states. Nebraska is the most regulated because it is the only state requiring one year of experience before one is eligible to sit for the exam.
