## 3 WAYS LICENSING LAWS HURT WORKERS



Makes the **WORKFORCE SHORTAGE WORSE.**



**CREATES DEPENDENCY ON GOVERNMENT** by creating barriers to work.



**DISCOURAGES NEW WORKERS** from entering the workforce.

## 3 STEPS TO A BRIGHTER FUTURE FOR NEBRASKA WORKERS

1

### LIMIT NEW BARRIERS TO WORK

Provides framework for legislators to evaluate any new licenses being proposed.

2

### REVIEW EXISTING BARRIERS TO WORK

Requires a review of existing occupational licenses with the goal of reducing overly restrictive licensing requirements.

3

### BALANCE PUBLIC SAFETY + OPPORTUNITY

Establish a process to make sure occupation licensing requirements are not wrongfully denying work to those who've served time without good reason.



Nebraska voters support requiring the Legislature to review the state's job licensing requirements on a regular basis.

Only 19% of Nebraskans oppose requiring the legislature to regularly review the state's job licensing requirements, while 19% are unsure.
